Hail Causes Total Loss on Corn on Eagle Township Farms

A hail storm coming down from the northwest Friday afternoon shortly after 3 o'clock and following a course toward the southeast brought almost total loss to corn and soybeans on some farms, and caused damage of diminishing proportions on others.
