

## James Burt

ESTHERVILLE — Services for James Glen Burt, 57, will be held Saturday at 10:30 a.m. at Henry-Olson-Fuhrman Funeral Chapel, Estherville with Pastor Paul Wiegman officiating. Interment will be in East Side Cemetery with full military rites observed by the Estherville Veterans of Foreign Wars and American Legion Posts. He died Wednesday, Nov. 12, 1986 at Holy Family Hospital.

He was born Feb. 7, 1929 near Swea City, the son of Glen and Gladys (Kennedy) Burt. He attended Seneca School and was a graduate of Mankato State University. He entered the military in 1946 and served in the United States Army for 22 years being stationed in Germany, Japan, Korea and Panama besides duty in the states. He retired in 1969. He managed the VFW for several years, owned and operated the Gingerbread House in Terril for three years and has worked as a maintenance man for the Estherville Schools for the past seven years. On June 11, 1976 he was united in marriage with Jackie Wieckert in the Presbyterian Church.

He was a life member of John W. Brawford Veterans of Wars Post 3388; life member of the Military Order of Cooties Pup Tent 31, Estherville and a member of the Ringsted American Legion Post.

He is survived by his wife Jackie, Estherville; one brother Joe Burt, Estherville; three sisters: Mrs. Merton (Elizabeth) McKean, Goldfield; Mrs. Ross (Helen) Aust and Mrs. Jerry (Dorothy) Thomas, both of Des Moines; many nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one brother.
